Farmers Markets

It is market season again! Markets provide an excellent opportunity to share information and literature about waste prevention and recycling at booths. 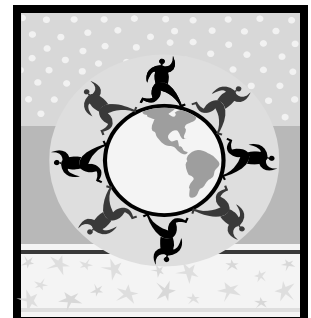

Master Recyclers is Alive and Well—Change is GOOD!

The Multnomah County Extension Service Office is closing at the end of June due to the elimination, by county government, of its operating budget. Programs housed in this office are being moved or eliminated. In order to continue our valuable program, OSU Extension and the Master Recycler advisory board decided the program should be centrally located in an urban setting with a fiscally stable environment. Although the program is outside funded, it requires a match of overhead and some support. Proposals from the City of Portland and Portland State University were reviewed. The board selected the City of Portland's Office of Sustainable Development. The program moved at the end of May.

Megan will leave the coordinator position at the end of June. The City of Portland has begun the hiring process and is expected to hire a new coordinator by the end of August. Carolyn Collopy, a program coordinator for the City of Portland, will act as interim program coordinator until a new coordinator is hired.

CDs, Video and Other Media Recycling!

Green Disk from Washington State now has expanded their recycling/reuse to include CDs, video tape and other media. They have several regional reprocessing centers: 1-800-305 DISK to find out more about how they can reprocess.

Create Your Own Opportunity

You are welcome to create your own volunteer opportunity at local events and other markets. Most of the time market and event coordinators are excited to have Master Recyclers at events and willingly make room.

Everyone should have a list of displays and kits available from Master Recyclers, City of Portland, Recycling Advocates, Metro and Clackamas County Solid Waste. Clackamas County is a great resource for people in that area—they have lots of great displays and very supportive staff.
