Program Description

The Master Recycler Program is a community engagement volunteer corps focused on sustainable consumption, climate protection, saving food, toxics reduction, composting and recycling. Each year, three 8-week trainings rotate through the three counties in the Portland metro region. Armed with outreach techniques and resources, graduates commit to thirty hours of community engagement. Master Recyclers volunteer at local events and through individual projects. They also receive ongoing training and support that includes a monthly newsletter, a website, open houses, volunteer placement with partners, an assigned mentor and assistance on individual projects.

The Master Recycler Program also partners with the Metro Environmental Promoter program to conduct the Community-Design program. This program aims to provide resources, training, a workforce, and project development for community-driven initiatives.

Specific communities come together as a group and design sustainability projects that meet their own goals and aspirations. Metro provides funds that help remove barriers in participation and provides community wealth.

Celebrating 30th Anniversary and Showing Resilience

Master Recyclers more than rose to the challenges that their communities faced this year, serving hundreds of families with food relief, collection of sharps and medication, information on food waste prevention, toxics reduction, consumption and recycling.

Rather than recruiting and training new Master Recyclers, focus was turned to supporting the existing corps of Master Recyclers. Efforts were made to provide meaningful trainings and workshops, volunteer opportunities were modified to ensure volunteer safety, access to digital tools were provided, and some COVID relief efforts (related to toxics and food) were added to eligible activities for Master Recycler hours. It was no small feat that Master Recyclers reported their fourth highest number of hours this pandemic year.

The program also kicked off its 30th anniversary which will be celebrated all 2021. Throughout the year there will be story-telling and evaluation, with a look to how the program can meet the challenges of tomorrow. Master Recycler Mentors also began meeting to plan for reinvigorating the volunteer corps as community events begin to reopen.

Community-Design Program

Winter Centro Cultural/Washington County Class 77

In November, the Master Recycler program partnered with Centro Cultural, Washington County, and Metro to conduct the second all Spanish-language and first ever online Master Recycler course.

Thirteen people participated. Course work included many of the same topics as the first all-Spanish course, but also included training on using online outreach tools and COVID safety guidelines. Participants in the first class also offered training and mentorship.

Community Driven Efforts

This fiscal year, the program continued to support efforts led by community-designed course partners. The three Community-Design programs partnered with Master Recyclers of Color to co-organize a weeklong virtual Earth Day celebration. This was an opportunity for them to network, share resources, and build community. Members of the four groups shared their own tips and resources on all topics related to materials management. - **Trash for Peace:** A non-profit that works with residents in low-income multifamily sites in the Metro region to improve recycling, waste reduction, green cleaning and hazardous waste reduction opportunities on their housing sites. The course took place in Fall 2019. Since then:
 - Members completed 245 hours.
 - Five are Certified.
 - The Master Recycler program assisted in developing a mini handbook for their new Environmental Promoter courses.
- **Centro Cultural:** promotes personal growth and empowerment for the Washington County Latino and low-income community. Courses were in Fall 2019 and Winter 2020. Since then:
 - Members completed 1430 hours
 - Eleven are Certified, 5 of whom are Centurions.
 - The group created a [Facebook page](#) and [YouTube channel](#) to provide ongoing weekly online workshops for the community.
 - They started [Pásalo, an active Facebook group](#) for swapping items for reuse.
 - Members of the first all-Spanish language class (Class 73) participated in training and mentorship for the new one (Class 77).
 - Members from both classes take pride in bringing recycling/compost projects in their own communities through their schools, churches and workplaces.
- **North by Northeast Community Health Center:** improves health outcomes and advance health equity by offering primary care services and health education and promotion focused on the African American/Black community. The course took place in Winter 2020. Since then:
 - Members completed 1102 hours.
 - Seventeen are Certified, 5 of whom are Centurions.
 - The group conducted 8 Safe Homes, Healthy Homes events. They started as health and sustainability fairs, but after COVID, these events became major relief events providing food boxes, education on sanitizing/ home air quality, COVID testing and supplies.

- Members also conducted sustainability outreach and food box distribution in their churches, AARP, Meals on Wheels, local schools. Two also joined the Community Warehouse Board and the Metro Regional Advisory Committee.

The Way We Get Things Done

Impacts of the Master Recycler Program: behavior change, equity and building community wealth.

Behavior Change: *Goal: Spur individual and family action through awareness-building, outreach and involvement*

- 13 people learned how to effectively recycle, compost, reduce toxics and consume sustainability by attending the course.
 - Washington County, Multnomah County, and Clackamas County were all canceled due to COVID
 - 13 community-design Centro Cultural/Washington County Spanish language virtual class.
- 12 speakers provided relevant and current information about actions people can take.
- No tours were conducted this year
- On-going trainings and gatherings for graduates:
 - MRoC (Master Recyclers of Color) organized a series of 5 Stop Hate workshops.
 - A region-wide bilingual virtual webinar and discussion took place in January to inform Master Recyclers of SB 582 Modernizing Oregon's Recycling System.
 - A week-long, bilingual, virtual Earth Day celebration was conducted by Environmental Promoters and Master Recyclers of Color.
 - Master Recyclers organized and attended a Ground Score webinar on the informal waste sector.
 - City of Portland Sustainability at Work Presentation Training.
 - Washington County week-long, bilingual, virtual sustainability fair.
 - Two Master Recycler Mentors gatherings.
- Web, social media, YouTube Chanel, lectures, workshops and tours were provided to graduates to keep them up to date. Newsletters are now both Spanish and English.

- Master Recyclers had over 59,000 contacts in the community.

Incorporate equity in sustainability engagement

Goal: Address institutional, technical and social constructs that keep communities of color and low-income communities from participating in sustainability efforts and include their world view and lifestyles in vision of sustainability. The class is asked to complete a demographics

survey. Survey data reflects only the people who responded, and people can choose more than one in several of the questions.

- MROC met monthly and organized 5 Stop Hate workshops. They have three committees focused on pesticides free food gardening, organizing a zine and general outreach.
- 13 scholarships were provided.
- The only class conducted this year was conducted in Spanish.
- The monthly newsletter and regionwide workshops were bilingual with Spanish and English.
- Community Designed participants received \$15/hour, interpretation services, laptops, WIFI and computer training.

Contribute to community wealth

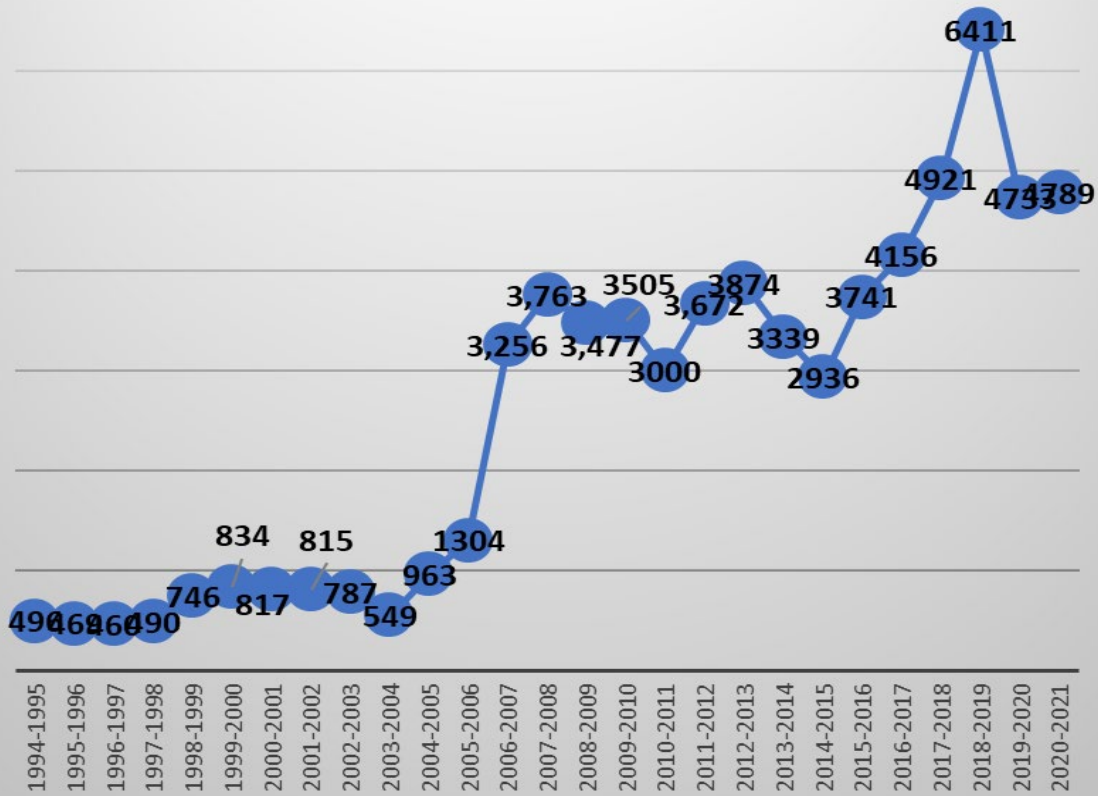
Goal: Build partnerships that are mutually beneficial. Leverage and highlight community sustainability efforts. Foster ongoing relationships with community leaders.

- Master Recyclers volunteered more than 4700 hours this year, contributing a value of \$120,000 to community efforts.
- Master Recyclers supported projects in 6 school related efforts including green teams, fundraising, event planning, sustainability events, and presentations.
- Master Recyclers spent about 3000 hours on individual projects to support efforts important to their own communities of faith, workplaces, neighborhoods, friends and family.
- 30 community partners leveraged about 1700 hours as board members or to engage people in multifamily no-contact outreach, food box distribution, Earth Day celebrations and advocacy.
- Community Design partners gained resources, relationships, and financial support for their community-driven initiatives.

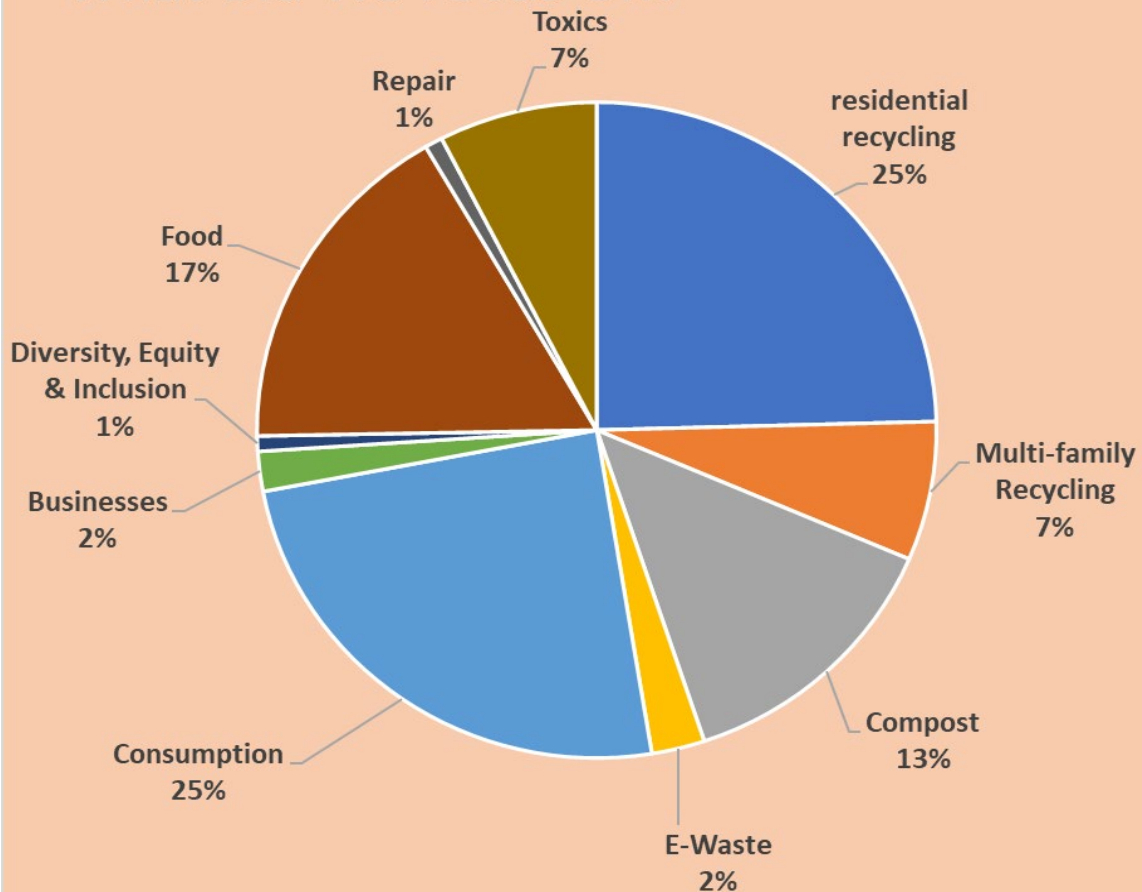
Volunteer Activities by the Numbers

Master Recyclers responded to the challenges of COVID and economic strife by deepening their commitments and supporting their communities. The following pages use graphs to demonstrate those hours.

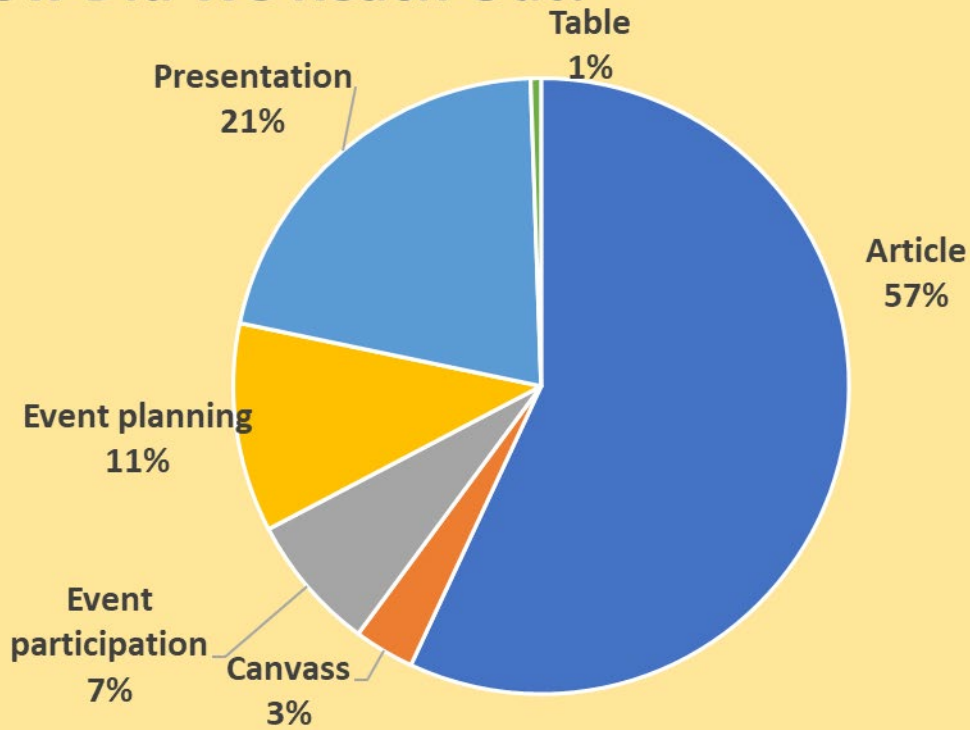
Hours Completed Yearly



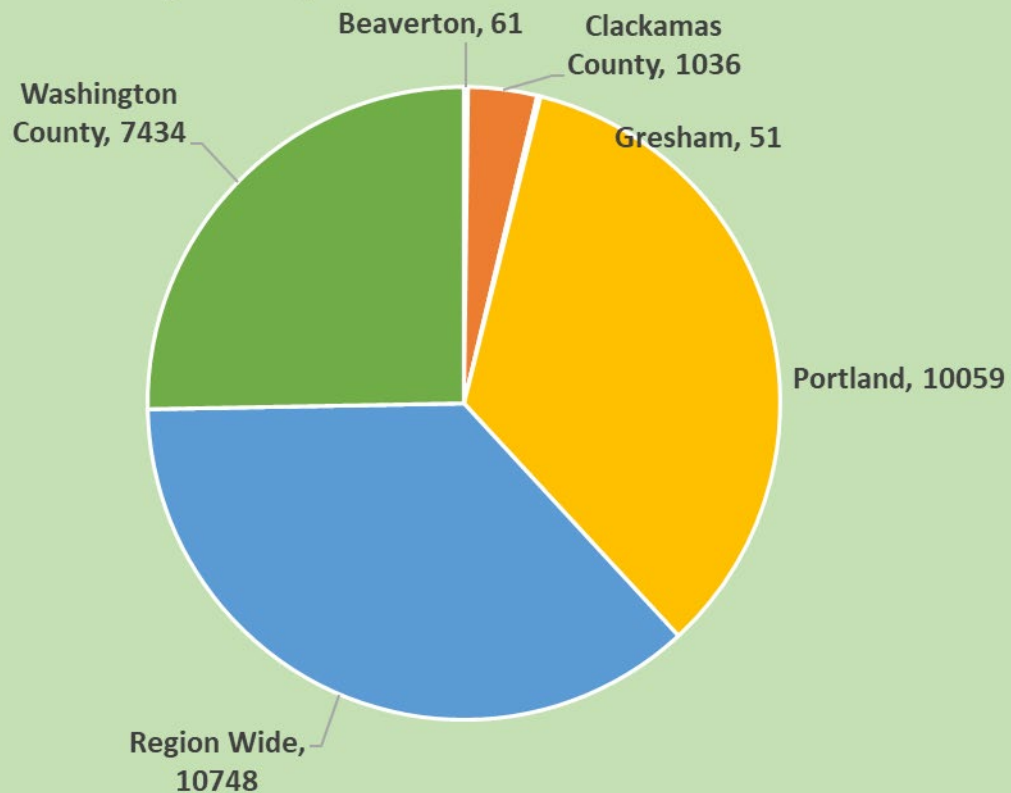
What Did We Focus On?



How Did We Reach Out?



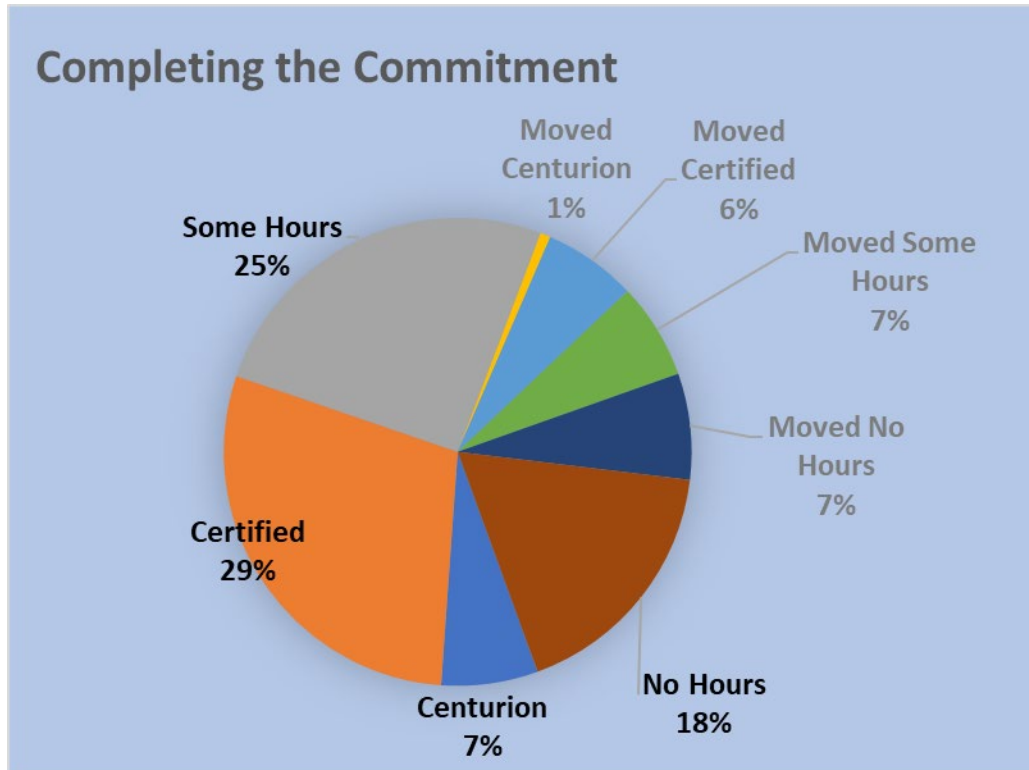
How Many People Did We Reach?
